

## Tech Tips: Sewer hose handling - by Roger Siminoff

During our stay at Flag City RV park in Lodi, CA (a great RV park to add to your list when going up I-5) on our way back from Oregon this past summer, I was walking our dog and observing the driver's side of the trailers near us. The RV Park had full hookups and most owners had their water, electric, cable, and sewer connected, ready to settle down for the night.

I noticed those owners who used water filters and those who didn't, the few that hooked up their electric through surge protectors, and was quite surprised to see those who had their sewer hose connected with their black-tank gate valve pulled open. While these owners may think that opening the blank-tank gate-valve puts them in a waste flow situation similar to what they have in their homes, it is actually quite different, and leaving the valve open is a bad idea. (cont'd.)

First, very few RV parks have "traps" in their sewer lines. A trap is a u-shaped coupling that virtually traps water in the bottom of its u-shape to prevent sewer gas from escaping from the sewer line and entering your home. (According to the type of sewer system you are connected to, sewer gas can range from harmful to fatal.) By leaving the black-tank gate-valve open, sewer gas will find its way up your sewer hose and into your black water tank. And, since the waste water is constantly flowing out through an open gate-valve, there is nothing to block the sewer gas from entering the trailer.

You may argue that the black water tank is vented – which it is – but that vent only allows gases to escape (and air to enter during dumping), it doesn't remove all gases from the tank.

The second issue is that the black water tank has a flat bottom. If the gate-valve stays open, liquid waste will flow out while any solid waste still accumulates at the base of the tank. (This is not the case when the gate-valve is kept closed, allowing the liquid-like mass of waste to accumulate until the gate-valve is opened whereupon all of the waste surges out of the system together.)

So, the ideal scenario is to hook up your sewer hose only when you need it. Or, if you do prefer to hook everything up when you arrive, then make it a point to keep the gate-valve closed until you are ready to dump.

While on the topic of waste tanks, for those of you who have a black-tank backwash, the instruction label on the side of your trailer advises not to run your backwash unless valve is open, but it doesn't say exactly when to run the backwash. The ideal time to begin the backwash is at the moment you open the gate valve. For proper cleaning of your tank, do not wait until you have emptied all black waste. Using the black-tank backwash while there is waste in the tank will help to set the surface of the waste liquid in motion, which aids in cleaning the walls of your tank. And, it's a good idea to empty your black tank first, followed by your grey tank (helps to flush out the waste hose).
