

Minutes of the General Meeting Of the Central Coast Unite of the WBCCI

14 Nov. 2015

Call to order. Past President John Thornton called the meeting to order at 4.55 pm. He welcomed all attendees, and reminisced about previous gatherings in the Ocean Mesa yurt.

John went on to encourage members to host rallies in the new year, commending the 2016 choices of the Rally Committee, Pam Lindsay, Bob Minder, Bruce Yeoman, and Gary Mellinger.

He noted that reservations for the December Wine Country RV rally would be held up while the Park set up a new reservation system.

Roll Call: no roll call was made, but the Board had previously ascertained that we had the required quorum.

Approval of minutes from last meeting. Minutes were neither read nor approved, since they had been sent out in May after the previous general meeting.

Rallies for 2016

Pam reported that the board wanted to make hosting rallies easier, given our growing numbers. One tactic was having multiple co-hosts so that hosting was still fun.

Board nominations for 2016.

John thanked the 2015 board, Roger Siminoff, Pam Lindsay, Paula Poll, Gary Mellinger, Carol Cunningham, Dan Jones, Mark Kiger, Bruce Yeoman, and Joe Deering, as well as web master Walt Bremer. He further thanked VP Pam Lindsay for taking over after Roger Siminoff's resignation.

Nominations for the 2016 board are: Pam Lindsay for president; Walt and Judy Bremer as co-VPs, , Bob Minder as treasurer, Gary Mellinger as Membership Chair, and Carol Cunningham as Secretary. Directors Joe Deering and Bruce Yeoman's terms continue. New director nominees are Paula Poll and Cal Meuser. Walt Bremer will continue as webmaster, and John and Carol Taggart will co-edit the newsletter. There were no nominations sent to the secretary or heard from the floor, and so the slate stands as is.

Elections: Christa Mellinger moved and Carol Taggart seconded the motion to accept the slate. It was accepted.

Rally Committee: Past President John Thornton asked for volunteers for the new rally committee. They will meet with the co-VPs (Judy and Walt); to plan 2017's rallies, including new places as well as old favorites. Volunteers included John Thornton, Bruce Yeoman, and Gary Mellinger (provided he is bribed with cookies).

Membership Gary Mellinger introduced the new members and gave them their CCC badges. The inductees were Alan and Robin Sokolow, Mark and Michelle Griffin, and Dave

and Diane Bolduan. They were welcomed with applause.

Treasurer's Report Paula Poll reported that CCC now has 61 regular members and 8 affiliates.

The checking account balance as of October 31, 2015 is \$9843.35, (including over \$2000 owed to Ocean Mesa for the November rally.

The CD account balance as of Oct. 31, 2015 is \$2,214.98, including the year's massive interest accumulation of \$1.23.

The full text of the treasurer's report is attached to the paper copy of these minutes. Paula ended by emphasizing the need for rally planners to keep rally expenses revenue neutral, and putting cut-off dates on rally coupons.

Region 12 Rally report: Chuck Pall and Bob Minder both attended the Region 12 Rally in Minden, NV. Bob's notes and handouts for the Rally are attached to these minutes. The 2016 Rally will be held in Hemet Oct 12-16, 2016, and 2017's will be Oct 10-15 at the Jackson Rancheria.

Membership:

Checking account balance as of October 31, 2015 is \$9843.35 (This amount includes over \$2000 owing to Ocean Mesa for the November rally). While this seems like a large treasury, we sometimes have to put down a large deposit to reserve a venue. For instance, we paid \$1700 to Ocean Mesa to reserve this venue last November.

CD Account balance as of October 31, 2015 is \$2.214.98. We earned \$1.23 interest last year.

Thank you to all of the members for renewing by check or using PayPal. We have set up payments to WBCCI by using Bank of America bill pay and sending the renewals by email. We also can receive unit dues from WBCCI via direct deposit in order to streamline our paperwork.

Our rally hosts have done a spectacular job of making sure our rallies are revenue neutral. Reminder to all rally hosts to download the excellent rally planning guide from the CCC website to use in planning a rally budget.

Currently we suggest a rally fee of \$17.50 per person or \$35 per couple which includes one main course dinner and two continental style breakfasts. If you wish to exceed that amount, please increase the rally fee. Attendees are often asked to bring a pot luck dish for dinner and appetizers, their own beverages, plates and flatware. Conversely, if you want to eliminate provided meals, reduce the rally fee.
